Please remember:

- Leave cell phones in your vehicle. If you are dropped off you may bring your phone inside and secure it in a locker to call your ride when visitation is over.
- No weapons, alcohol, tobacco, lighters, or contraband of any kind are allowed inside the building and must be left in your vehicle.
- Make sure your vehicle is secured, windows rolled all the way up and doors are locked.

Audio and video surveillance devices are used on all EDCF property.

In the event you have a problem or questions at any time during your visit, please consult with the Visitation Staff Sergeant or Security Shift Supervisor on duty.

Policy Statement on Visiting

The Department of Corrections recognizes the importance of visitation in making a resident's period of incarceration less difficult. With those residents who have families, visiting privileges allow for the maintenance of family ties that may otherwise be lost. A resident's motivation to improve his condition is affected in a positive way when he has regular visits from family and friends.

This handbook has been designed to inform visitors at EDCF of the facility's rules and regulations as they pertain to visitation. Rules and regulations in regard to visiting are necessary for all facilities. This handbook as well as our visiting program has been set up to provide a fair, wholesome and safe environment for visitors, residents and staff. All EDCF staff assigned to the visitation area shall strictly enforce all visiting rules and regulations in a polite and professional manner.

Although we feel visitation is an important element in the correctional process, your visiting privileges can be revoked / suspended for violating our rules and regulations. Please read this handbook carefully to avoid any unnecessary delay or interruption of your visiting privileges.

Keep in mind the facility is highly resistant to making exceptions to the regulations outlined in this handbook.

VISITORS DRESS CODE:

The following type of clothing <u>will be considered INAPPROPRIATE attire</u> for visiting:

- A. See-through / fishnet attire
- B. Tank tops/Halter tops/Tube tops
- C. White T-shirts
- D. Spaghetti strap or tie-tops
- E. Braless attire
- F. Backless shirts or dresses
- G. Undergarments showing
- H. Low cut neckline or clothing that reveals any part of the breast
- I. Clothing that reveals bare shoulder, bare midriff
- J. Skirts or dresses that do not cover the knee while in a sitting position or has a slit that goes above the knee
- K. Spandex, leggings, jeggings or any other stretch / form fitting clothing to include skinny jeans or yoga pants.
- L. Sweat pants/workout pants
- M. Wrap skirts or shirts
- N. Pajamas or sleep attire
- O. Hats or other headwear (excluding religious tenet)
- P. Sunglasses
- Q. Watches/Fitbits/Smart Watches
- R. Red, Grey, or orange (hooded or not) sweatshirts
- S. Collared, blue / denim button up shirt
- T. Tear away clothing
- U. Overalls / coveralls
- V. Foot wear must be worn at all times, open toe shoes are acceptable i.e. flip flops/sandals
- W. Shorts: except for those who are 10 years of age or under.
- X. Clothing with holes / tears / scratches or rips, factory made or otherwise, despite whether or not they are all the way through the material.
- Y. Attire that promotes violence, illegal activities, Gang affiliation or are of a sexual nature.
- Z. Attire that promotes alcohol and/or tobacco products

<u>Regardless of age. all visitors allowed into this facility must be dressed</u> in compliance with this dress code.

All clothing considered to be outer garments shall be removed during the entry process. The clothing underneath the outer garments must be suitable for entry into the facility. For example, a visitor will not be allowed to enter with a tank top on even if the visitor has another garment to put over the tank top.

The above-mentioned list includes clothing that is not acceptable; however, this list is not meant to be all-inclusive. <u>The facility reserves the right to</u> <u>deny any visitor when it is determined a visitor's dress is not</u> <u>appropriate, even though they may not be wearing one of the previously</u> <u>listed items of apparel.</u> (C) defined as contraband by rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of social and rehabilitation services, in a care and treatment facility by an employee of a care and treatment facility, except as provided in subsection (b)(3); or

(D) defines as contraband by rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner of the juvenile justice authority, in a juvenile correctional facility by an employee of a juvenile correctional facility, except as provided by subsection (b)(3); and(3) severity level4, nonperson felony if:

(A) Such items are firearms, ammunition or explosives, in a correctional institution by an employee of a correctional institution or in a care and treatment facility by an employee of a care and treatment facility or

(B) a violation of (a)(5) or (a)(6) by an employee or volunteer of the department of corrections, or the employee or volunteer of a contractor who is under contract to provide services to the department of corrections.

(c) The provisions of subsection (b)(2)(A) shall not apply to the possession of a firearm or ammunition by a person licensed under the personal and family protection act, K.S.A. 75-7c01 et seq. and amendments thereto, in a parking lot open to the public if the firearm or ammunition is carried on the person while in a vehicle or while securing the firearm or ammunition in the vehicle, or stored out of plain view in a locked but unoccupied vehicle.

(d) As used in this section: (1) Correctional institution means any state correctional institution or facility, conservation camp, state security hospital, juvenile correctional facility, community correction center or facility for detention or confinement, juvenile detention facility or jail; (2) care and treatment facility means the state security hospital provided for under K.S.A. 76-1305 et seq., and amendments thereto, and a facility operated by the department for social and rehabilitation services for the purposes provided for under K.S.A 59-29a02 et seq., and amendments thereto; and (3) lawful custody means the same as in K.S.A. 21-5912, and amendments thereto.

Prison Rape Elimination Act:

It is the top priority of the Kansas Department of Corrections to educate staff, resident and the general public about the Prison Rape Elimination Act, which was signed into law in 2003. Our goal at EDCF is to eliminate sexual assaults in the facility. Residents in the facility are encouraged to report such occurrences immediately to staff or via the hotline to assist them in that reporting. If you receive any such information about such an incident, you are encouraged to contact the EAI Department at EDCF by calling (316) 321-7284 ext. 22017. The warden of the facility has established a zero tolerance level for such activity.

<u>Warning</u>

21-5919 - Traffic in Contraband in a Correctional Institution:

(a) Traffic in contraband in a correctional institution or care and treatment facility is, without the consent of the administrator of the correctional institution or care and treatment facility.

(1) Introducing or attempting to introduce any item into or upon the grounds of any correctional institution or car and treatment facility.

(2) Taking, sending, attempting to take or attempting to send any item from any correctional institution or care and treatment facility.

(3) any unauthorized possession of any item while in any correctional institution or care and treatment facility;

(4) distributing any time within any correctional institution or care and treatment facility;

(5) supplying to another who is in lawful custody any object or thing adapted or designed for use in making an escape; or

(6) introducing into an institution in which a person is confined any object or thing adapted or designed for use in making any escape.

(b) Traffic in contraband in a correctional institution or care and treatment facility is a;

(1) Severity level 6, nonperson felony, except as provided in subsection
(b)(2) or (b)(3);

(2) Severity level 5, nonperson felony if such items are

(A) Fire arms, ammunition, explosives or a controlled substance which is defined in K.S.A 2010 Supp. 21-36a01, and amendments thereto, except as provided in subsection (b)(3);

(B) defined as contraband by rules and regulations adopted by the Secretary of Corrections, in a state correctional institution or facility by an employee of a state correctional institution or facility, except as provided in subsection (b)(3);

General Information

- 1. Entering For Visitation: Visitor traffic on the facility perimeter road is prohibited. Park vehicle in the North parking areas. Vehicle windows and doors must be completely closed and locked during visitation. Proceed to the Visitors Reception Desk located inside the Administration Building. Await further instructions for check-in-procedures. Visitors shall not be permitted in the visiting room until fully processed.
- 2. Exiting the Facility: To exit the facility, you proceed back through the same door you entered upon arrival. Once you have left the facility you will not be permitted to re-enter.
- 3. **Reception:** Before you are allowed to visit, you will be asked to produce a valid picture I.D. Any valid state or government issued photo ID is acceptable i.e. drivers license, passport etc. A birth certificate shall be utilized for minors each time they are to visit. All visitors are required to fill out a Visitor's Registration Form. (Full Completion of this Form is Required Each Time You Visit) Any person refusing to complete this form shall not be allowed to enter the facility.

All persons entering must pass a metal detector screening. Any person(s) refusing to comply with any part of the check-in process shall be denied entry into the facility. You will be allowed (3) attempts to pass the metal detector. If you fail to pass on the third attempt, you will not be allowed to enter the facility unless you have a medical device and **a doctor's note approving the device**. In these cases, you will be pat searched in the area of detection. All medical devices that do not allow a person to pass through the metal detector shall require the person to present a medical approval from a doctor and a full pat search from a same sex security staff member.

- 4. Lockers: Visitors must leave purses, wallets, keys, make-up of any kind (to include lip balm) candy/lozenges, photographs etc., in lockers located in the reception area. Electronic devices (i.e. pager, cameras, phones, or internet capable watches) are not allowed into the facility and must be secured in the visitor's automobile when possible. Cell phones shall be shut off and secured in a locker ONLY in the event you have been dropped off and need to contact your ride at the conclusion of your visit. EDCF assumes no responsibility for any lost or stolen items. All loose items in your pockets shall be placed in a locker.
- 5. Personal Property and/or Money: Under no circumstances will personal property and/or money be accepted or exchanged during visitation with staff or residents.

- 6. **Resident Deposits:** As specified in **IMPP 04-103** Resident Trust Funds, all deposits to resident accounts are required to be completed electronically through a vendor(s) contracted by the department to conduct such transactions. See contact information listed above.
- 7. Seating: Tables are not to be moved from their original position. Residents must sit across the table from their visitor. There is a limit of four visitors per resident. All persons shall keep the legs of the chair flat on the floor at all times. Feet or any miscellaneous items (diaper bags, jackets etc.) are not permitted to be placed in any unused chair. No sitting on the table top regardless of age.
- **8.** No strolling or walking around the visitation area. Visitors are to remain seated unless entering or leaving the area, using the restroom or purchasing items from the vending machines.
- **9. Vending services:** Are available during visitation. The visitor will be allowed to purchase items from the vending machines using a credit card or vending service pre-paid debit convenience card.
- **10. Infirmary Visitation:** Residents able to leave the infirmary for visitation will be allowed to do so. Residents restricted to the infirmary will not have visitation in the infirmary area.

Visitation privileges shall be determined by the incentive level assigned to each resident in the following manner:

Intake Level / **Level 0-**Residents assigned to the Intake Level shall be limited to visits from attorneys, clergy, and law enforcement.

Level I - Residents assigned to Level I shall be limited to visits from attorneys, clergy, law enforcement, a primary visitor, and immediate family members.

Levels II & III - Residents assigned to Levels II and III shall be allowed visits from any approved visitors per the provisions of this IMPP. Only level III residents are allowed to take photographs during visitation.

Responsibility of Children:

If a visitor brings in a child of whom they do not have lawful / residential custody the following needs to be filled out which states:

I, <u>Full Name of Parent/Guardian give permission for Visitor Full</u> <u>Name to bring Child's full name</u> to the El Dorado Correctional Facility to visit Resident Full Name.

The document **must be notarized** and given to the visitation Officers, along with a birth certificate EVERY time the minor is brought in. The birth certificate / is the only document needed when the biological mother or residential custodian brings the minor into the facility. Proof of guardianship is also necessary.

Diaper bags: The contents of diaper bags shall be limited to:

- (6) diapers
- (3) plastic (see through) bottles
- (1) clear dispenser/baggie of wet wipes
- (1) change of clothes for the infant
- (1) infant blanket no larger than a standard receiving blanket
- (1) pacifier
- (1) baby/toddler food in factory sealed (plastic) containers only.

* Dry formula may be placed in bottle before entering the visitation area. Open formula containers shall not be permitted in the visitation area.

*All contents of the diaper bag are subject to search.

*The diaper bag is to be made of a clear see through material

Breastfeeding: Mothers shall be allowed to breastfeed a child while visiting and the feeding may take place in the visiting room.

Handicap Assistance:

If you are handicapped and need assistance with a wheelchair, notify a staff member, who will ensure that proper assistance is obtained.

If I Am an Ex-Employee (Includes Contract Personnel of EDCF) Can I Visit s Resident at the Institution?

KAR 44-7-104 totally restricts visitation for a period of two (2) years following departmental employment. After 2 years have elapsed, you may be considered for visiting privileges. Final approval rests with the Warden.

Why Would My Visiting Privileges be Suspended?

A visit may be denied or terminated under the following circumstances by the unit team manager or in the unit team manager's absence, by the highest ranking security officer on duty:

1. Visitors under the influence of drugs or alcohol

2. Insufficient space is available

3. Refusal of visitor(s) to submit to search procedures per IMPP 12-115

4. Refusal or failure to produce sufficient identification or the falsifying of information by the visitor

5. Violation of facility visiting rules by visitor or resident

6. Failure to properly supervise children

7. Excessive physical contact/inappropriate contact

8. Reasons necessary to preserve the security of the facility and reasonable order in the visiting area

9. Visitors who were found in possession of a cell phone, narcotics, and or tobacco products during the searching procedures.

Please note: Visitors can be searched to prevent the introduction of any item considered to be contraband if taken into or from a facility. This includes but not limited to cell phones. narcotics. tobacco. tobacco-related items and alcohol products.

What If I am a Victim of the Resident but I Would Like to Visit the Resident?

This does not mean that you will not be allowed to visit. If you are a victim of the resident, you must indicate this on your visiting application, the officer of Victim Services (OVS) will contact you for more information. If you have question about this process, please call OCS toll free at (866) 404-6732.

What happens in the Event of an Emergency?

This facility has protocols, based on the nature, of most emergency situations. An officer will brief you on the event and direct you to the nearest safe zone.

If I am on Probation or Parole, will I be allowed to Visit?

If you are on probation or parole and have an immediate family member incarcerated at EDCF (i.e. brother, son, father), you will be allowed to visit only after one year of successful probation or parole and receive permission from your probation or parole officer <u>and</u> the Warden at EDCF. This request will be initiated by you through your probation or parole officer.

Who May Visit?

It is policy of the facility not to allow any person under the age of eighteen (18) to visit unless that person is an immediate family member of the resident, i.e. sibling, step-sibling, child, step-child, grandchild, niece, nephew or spouse. All persons under the age of eighteen (18) who are members of the immediate family; except for a spouse, may not visit unless they are accompanied by a parent, legal guardian vesting the person with authority to transport and supervise the minor child on the premises of this facility for the purpose of visiting an resident.

Cousins are not considered immediate family.

*Visitors may arrive no earlier than 30 minutes prior to the start of their scheduled visitation sessions to allow for processing. If you arrive late, your visit will not be extended to accommodate your late arrival.

Restrictive Housing (Control Units):

A. All Restrictive Housing Residents located in A, B and C cell houses will only have video visitation through IC Solutions. The visitor will schedule their visit through the IC Solutions website and those visits are **30 minutes in length and are limited to one per day.**

What is Permitted in the Visiting Area?

No paper money or coins are permitted in the visitation area. Vending machines are available and items shall be paid for with a credit/debit card.

Is There Someone At EDCF Who Will Watch My Children While

Visiting? NO. Parents and guardians are responsible for the supervision and

behavior of their children. Your visit may be terminated if there is any disruptive, unsafe, or inappropriate behavior exhibited from children while at EDCF. Persons of any age and/or pets shall not be left unattended in automobiles.

If I bring someone with me who is Not Going to Visit, is there a Place She/he Can Wait For Me?

There is no waiting area, do not bring someone who cannot visit if they are intending to wait for you at the facility. No one is permitted to wait in a vehicle in either the parking lot nor the entrance foyer. Anyone who is not visiting shall be required to exit the facility grounds.

I Understand Each Resident is allowed to Have 20 Visitors on His List. Can All Visitors Come to Visit at the Same Time?

Due to space constraints the number of visitors shall be held to **three** individuals. The visiting officer may terminate visits due to space limitations. Once a visit is established subsequent visitors will not be allowed entrance. All visitors participating in the same visit must be processed simultaneously.

Visitation of More Than One (1) Resident

Unless you are a relative and have more than one immediate family member incarcerated at this facility, multiple visits are not permitted. Visiting Program Sponsors and clergymen are exempt from this regulation when approval is received in advance from facility staff.

Private Visiting:

A private visiting area shall be provided for consultation by attorneys and clergy, or other persons having a statutory right of privileged communication to permit confidential conversations. Arrangements for this type of visit may be made during normal working hours by contacting the facility attorney or chaplain 24 hours prior to requested day of visit. There are special requirements for this type of visits which will be explained by the person of contact.

Personal Contact:

A quick hug and kiss are allowed at the beginning and the end of the visit.

There is to be no interaction between a resident and a visitor that is not on that resident's approved visitor list. There is no movement allowed between tables with residents and their visitors. Residents and visitors shall not be allowed to have physical contact with another resident's visitors.

Movement to the restrooms and security station is permitted.

At no time is any visitor, regardless of age, allowed to sit on an resident's lap. No visitors are permitted to interrupt or open another visitors non-contact visitation door.
