

## **Completion Criteria**

#### **Tier I – Education or Employment Only**

- Employment Services Obtain a job and keep it for 30 days.
- Education Services Complete remaining credits for graduation or GED. The completion standard is engaging in education services and staying on task for more than 75% of their time with the program and complete at least one goal listed in their individual education plan.

#### Tier II – Court-ordered groups and education completion

- Complete at least one required cognitive-behavioral group
- Obtain remaining credits for a high school diploma
- Taking the GED exam

#### Tier III -

- Moderate Risk Completion criteria involves completing at least two elements of programming (cognitive-behavioral programming, education, or job skills training)
- High-risk Completion criteria is to complete at three elements of programming (cognitive-behavioral programming, education, or job skills training)



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
