## Reinvestment Subcommittee 10/18/2023

- a. **Juvenile Defense** No updates as Gault Center continues to plan further training opportunities and working with Appleseed on initiatives in Kansas.
- b. Mental Health First Aid no real updates since last time. Contract is signed and in place for 3 years of trainings (4 X's per year) with the option of 2 additional 1 year renewals. Trainings are set for FY'24.
- c. Gender Responsivity same, no real new updates. Contract is signed and in place for 3 years of trainings (4 X's per year) with the option of 2 additional 1 year renewals. Trainings are set for FY'24.
- d. **Family Engagement** Standards for family engagement are in the final stages of approval. Videos of support from stakeholders are being developed and started by The Carey Group Training materials are being created for early 2024 training of staff and supervisors.
- e. **Parent Project** Not enough for face to face so we may recommend a virtual option to those wanting to attend. Lowish number (25) reported would attend training. At this point it is not recommended to host an in-person training by KDOC or the Parent Project owners (60 recommended to host an in-person, could possibly host for 30 plus). Opportunity will be there for those needing training to participate via a virtual training option if not wanting to hit the magic number to host an in-person Kansas training.
- f. **MRT**: Recent survey indicated enough staff requesting a MRT training. A contract and discussion would first have to occur with CCI. Approximately 25 staff stated they would like to participate in a MRT training if offered.
