

Out of State Juvenile Found in Kansas

Juvenile Status

Absconder, Escapee, Juvenile Charged as Delinquent or Foster Care Runaway

Out of state Absconders should have a Warrant or Pick-Up Order and a NCIC Missing Person / Runaway Report on file. If there's a tip where the out of state Absconder is residing, the out of state Warrant and/or NCIC Report, enable Kansas law enforcement to arrest and detain the juvenile for return to their home state.

When an out of state Absconder has been found in Kansas,
Complete the Online Runaway Information Sheet
Fax (785-296-8144) or E-mail (KansasICJ@doc.ks.gov) to Kansas ICJ.
Include Warrants, Intake Reports, Police Reports and NCIC Data if available.



KS- ICJ informs the juvenile's home state ICJ Office and verifies if the juvenile will be returned.



If no STOP.
KS-ICJ informs the Kansas Local Agency the juvenile can be released and to whom.



If yes, KS-ICJ works with Kansas County detaining the out of state juvenile on a signed ICJ Form III for voluntary return. Upon receipt, Form III is E-mailed to the home state's ICJ Office.



If the out of state juvenile refuses to sign Form III for voluntary return, KS-ICJ consults with the home state ICJ Office regarding a Requisition. The home state ICJ Office will either proceed with a formal ICJ request to "order" the juvenile returned. Or, they will inform KS-ICJ the juvenile can be released and to whom.



After receiving ICJ Form III from KS-ICJ, the juvenile's home state ICJ Office finalizes travel plans. When the transport date is known, KS-ICJ shares the information with our Local Agency. Ideally, the out of state juvenile is returned within 5 business days after signing Form III, but not always.



The home state ICJ Office informs KS-ICJ about the juvenile's successful return by E-mail. KS-ICJ closes the juvenile's Absconder / Runaway file.
