Functional Family Therapy (FFT) Information Sheet

Program Description

FFT is intensive short-term therapy delivered in the home or, on occasion, a convenient location for the family if the therapist deems the home unsafe. Therapy sessions will address improving family dynamics. See the Provider's pamphlet/fact sheet for a detailed explanation.

A session is generally 1-1 ½ hour per week, but three (3) sessions can occur within ten (10) days for crises. Within 15 days of the first session, a *treatment plan* will be given to the designated FFT contact person and the family. Upon request, the therapist will update the officer as to whether therapy is progressing as per the treatment plan and whether a weekly session has occurred.

A family must complete three (3) major phases during a period of 60-180 days to complete FFT treatment. The therapist will send to the designated FFT contact a *Phase Completion Form* within five (5) days of a family completing a major phase and a *Discharge Summary Report* within five (5) days of the family's discharge.

Additionally, the designated FFT contact will receive a *Caseload Report*, at the beginning of the month, reflecting the therapy hours for each week per family during the previous month. It will consist of current participants, discharged families, and those attending boosters, which are post-treatment sessions for kids who begin to display old behavior.
