Overview:	ART® is an evidenced-based, nationally recognized program that has been consistently shown to reduce aggressive, acting out behaviors while increasing pro-social behaviors in high-risk youth. ART® is a ten-week, multi-modal program with three coordinated and integrated components: Social Skills Training, Anger Control Training, and Moral Reasoning. Originally developed by Dr. Barry Glick and Dr. Arnold Goldstein, ART® has shown to be highly effective if delivered with integrity and fidelity to the program.

Overview:	The MRT Facilitator Training consists of four days of instruction to learn the MRT curriculum and the use of MRT with "treatment resistant" clients. This intensive training combines the use of lectures, discussions, and experiential exercises to explore the dynamics and basic personality traits of clients. Participants will be presented the outcome research on MRT effectiveness. The trainer will demonstrate and explain the MRT method (primary characteristics, evolution, and application) as a cognitive-behavioral treatment.

This information helps officers select the most appropriate goals for a youth and to develop an effective case management plan.
