Overview:	ART [®] is an evidenced-based, nationally recognized program that has been consistently shown to reduce aggressive, acting out behaviors while increasing pro-social behaviors in high-risk youth. ART [®] is a ten-week, multi-modal program with three coordinated and integrated components: Social Skills Training, Anger Control Training, and Moral Reasoning. Originally developed by Dr. Barry Glick and Dr. Arnold Goldstein, ART [®] has shown to be highly effective if delivered with integrity and fidelity to the program.

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Training Name:	Effective Practices in Correctional Settings II (EPICS II) – Graduated Responses	
Overview:	In this training participants will review the Principles of Effective Intervention (PEI) and learn a system of skills that can be used when working with youth to increase prosocial choices and decrease antisocial choices. Following the practice of EPICS II skills, the training will shift to focus on how graduated responses can be used effectively in interactions with youth. This training is highly interactive, hands-on and incorporates practice opportunities which allow participants to feel confident in using the skills in their role. The training process also includes on-site feedback and coaching after the initial training.

This assessment aids in the identification of a youth’s individual risks, needs, strengths, barriers, and incentives. The information gathered from the assessment helps supervision staff work with a youth to select the most appropriate goals and develop an effective case management plan.
