STANDARD: Written policy, procedure and practice shall require the Community Supervision Agency to provide resources for the assignment and completion and community service work.

Payment in lieu of community service work completion shall be prohibited.

If additional community service work hours are assigned as an internal sanction by the Community Supervision Agency, written policy, procedure, and practice shall define the authority for adding such hours and the specific behaviors that may lead to this sanction. The authority to apply this sanction must be approved by the Court, be authorized as a condition of assignment/probation or be stated in a list of alternative sanctions provided to the juvenile (still approved by the Court) at the juvenile's onset of supervision.

DISCUSSION: At the discretion of the Court and/or Community Supervision Agency Director (or designee), the community service work hours may be waived if the juvenile is unable to fulfill the requirements due to a documented physical, emotional, medical, or other limitations beyond their control. Documentation supporting the limitation(s) along with a written and appropriately signed waiver should be contained in the juvenile's case file.

NOTE: The standards and procedures set forth herein are intended to establish operational guidelines for community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners and their employees/contractors and the juvenile offenders under supervision. They are not intended to establish state created liberty interests for community supervision agencies, or the board of county commissioners, or their employees/contractors, or juvenile offenders, or an independent duty owed by the Kansas Department of Corrections- Division of Juvenile Services to community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners or their employees/contractors, supervised juvenile offenders or third parties. This standard and procedure is not intended to establish or create new constitutional rights or to enlarge or expand upon existing constitutional rights or duties.
