STANDARD: Written policy, procedure and practice shall require the Immediate Intervention Program (IIP) to have an office and field safety policy for employees and youth.

DISCUSSION: The IIP should consider the following when determining a response to a possibly violent or dangerous situation:

- Staff safety
- Youth safety
- Prevention planning
- De-escalation techniques
- No risk-taking
- Natural disaster
- Facility safety
- The transportation of youth
- Active shooter
- Continuity of operations planning

The IIP may coordinate their safety and emergency procedures with the Director of the local Emergency Management Services.

NOTE: The standards and procedures set forth herein are intended to establish operational guidelines for community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners and their employees/contractors and the juvenile offenders under supervision. They are not intended to establish state created liberty interests for community supervision agencies, or the board of county commissioners, or their employees/contractors, or juvenile offenders, or an independent duty owed by the Kansas Department of Corrections- Division of Juvenile Services to community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners or their employees/contractors, supervised juvenile offenders or third parties. This standard and procedure is not intended to establish or create new constitutional rights or to enlarge or expand upon existing constitutional rights or duties.
