STANDARD: Written policy, procedure and practice shall require that the Community Supervision Agency and its employees do not discriminate upon youth and/or families based upon race, gender, color, sex, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, sexual orientation, physical/mental disability and/or economic status.

DISCUSSION: The non-discrimination policy shall always be applied by the Community Supervision Agency and the Agency’s employees when conducting assessments, making recommendations and providing equal access to community programs and services. This does not preclude the Community Supervision Agency from contracting with providers and developing partnerships with agencies and organizations that have programs and services designed to address the risks and needs of specific populations (e.g. gender specific, culture specific, age specific, etc.). For guidance on the discrimination policy refer to Administrative County’s Condition of Grant.

NOTE: The standards and procedures set forth herein are intended to establish operational guidelines for community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners and their employees/contractors and the juvenile offenders under supervision. They are not intended to establish state created liberty interests for community supervision agencies, or the board of county commissioners, or their employees/contractors, or juvenile offenders, or an independent duty owed by the Kansas Department of Corrections- Division of Juvenile Services to community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners or their employees/contractors, supervised juvenile offenders or third parties. This standard and procedure is not intended to establish or create new constitutional rights or to enlarge or expand upon existing constitutional rights or duties.
