STANDARD: Written policy, procedure and practice shall permit the Community Supervision Agency Director or designee to sign the following non-medical consents for juveniles in dispositional court ordered Kansas Department of Corrections-Juvenile Services (KDOC-JS) custody and/or temporary court ordered KDOC-JS custody when a parent(s)/guardian(s) are unavailable or refuse to sign:

- Attendance at camps
- Attendance at cultural events
- Attendance at recreational events
- Permission to participate in sports
- Permission to transport off campus by staff at institutional/residential centers
- Permission to participate in driver's education classes
- Release of information
- Application to enter special training programs

Events such as travel outside the United States, permission to make a major purchase, applying to enter Job Corps or military service and/or permission to marry, when the parents are unavailable or refuse to consent, shall be reviewed and approved by the Court.

DISCUSSION: None.

NOTE: The standards and procedures set forth herein are intended to establish operational guidelines for community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners and their employees/contractors and the juvenile offenders under supervision. They are not intended to establish state created liberty interests for community supervision agencies, or the board of county commissioners, or their employees/contractors, or juvenile offenders, or an independent duty owed by the Kansas Department of Corrections- Division of Juvenile Services to community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners or their employees/contractors, supervised juvenile offenders or third parties. This standard and procedure is not intended to establish or create new constitutional rights or to enlarge or expand upon existing constitutional rights or duties.
