Re: Coronavirus Updates

As we have shared in previous weeks, we all need to pay attention to the seasonal influenza (flu) and each of us get vaccinated this year. We are in the final stages of scheduling the flu clinics for residents and staff across the state. Those dates have been set for residents and about half of them for staff, with a few facilities having started on Monday the 5th. As soon as all are set, we will get a complete schedule out to everyone.

This year we have added incentives for both residents and staff to encourage everyone to participate. In addition to providing the vaccine free of charge, the following participation incentives will be provided for residents and staff.

- Residents will receive \$5.00 deposited to your account that may be used for canteen purchases, phone calls or any allowable use you decide.
- Staff are eligible to receive one (1) Health Quest Credit from the State Employee Health Plan (SEHP). In addition, their health plan providing for 100% of the vaccine cost for covered dependents.

Residents, within the next day or so you will also receive a flyer via JPAY on this incentive.

Finally, we appreciate your understanding last week when current limits on staff resources caused us to be unable to post updated COVID-19 data. Until we complete our recruitment process this may happen from time to time, but please know it is simply a resource issue. I understand this data is important to each of you.

This week we can provide you two sets of data so that you are current and see the weekly changes since the last data set on September 23, 2020. And with these data sets, we've added additional information on whether or not each specific facility is currently housing positive residents. If a facility lists positive resident(s) and a "no" in the housed at this facility column, that reflects that the positive resident(s) were moved to a COVID-19 Medical Unit at one of our other facilities.
