


### Community Corrections ADP by Fiscal Year

### ■ 12-month Average Daily Population

















Community Corrections Case Closures by Fiscal Year

- Agency
  - Continuing Stakeholder Education
  - Availability of Behavioral Health Services
  - Not all treatment available uniformly across the state
- Administrative
  - 31 distinctly different agencies




### FIELD SERVICES | Overview

- Parole and Post Release
- Compact Felony Probation and Parole
  - The Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision is mandated by federal and state law.
    - Principle of controlled movement and continuous supervision for community safety.
    - Utilizes a national web-based database.
    - KDOC staff track all supervised offenders coming into Kansas for supervision and transferring from Kansas.







KS Cases Out-of-state Post Release Supervision (June 30, 2018)







### 5,784 Offenders Total




