ADJUDICATION ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2017

*unless stated otherwise

- 1. Court must find and enter into the written order that the juvenile poses a significant risk of harm to another or damage to property.
- 2. Court shall establish a specific term of commitment as specified in this subsection, unless the judge conducts a departure hearing and finds substantial and compelling reasons to impose a departure sentence as provided in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 38-2371, and amendments thereto.
- 3. The term of commitment shall not exceed the overall case length limit.
- 4. Prior to being committed to a juvenile correctional facility, the court shall administer a risk assessment tool (K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 38-2360) or review a risk assessment tool that was administered within the past six months to the juvenile.
- 5. Court must find Chronic offenders and Serious II & III offenders <14 years of age pose a significant risk of physical harm to another. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 38-2369(e)
- 6. Upon a finding by the trier of fact during adjudication that a firearm was used in the commission of an offense by the accused which, if committed by an adult, would constitute a felony, a judge may commit the juvenile directly to the custody of the secretary of corrections for placement in a juvenile correctional facility or youth residential facility for a minimum term of six months and up to a maximum term of 18 months, regardless of the risk level of such juvenile as determined by a risk and needs assessment.

The period of conditional release shall be limited to a maximum of six months and shall be subject to graduated responses. The presumption upon release shall be a return to the juvenile's home, unless the case plan developed pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 38-2373, and amendments thereto, recommends a different reentry plan.
